As such, general education disciplines and technical programs utilize the common rubric for the assessment of workplace skills to measure performance across six areas; attendance, punctuality, and reliability, productivity, attitude, respect, teamwork and cooperation, and problem solving and decision making. Faculty utilize the range below to determine student performance. A score of 80% or better is considered proficient.
